Here the standards are reorganized in terms of the major tasks of a program evaluation. This helps the user of the evaluation to see that the Standards can be applied throughout the process of planning, conducting, and reporting the evaluation. It also illustrates that some standards typically are more applicable than others to certain evaluation tasks. However, it would be a mistake to apply only the identified standards for a given task without determining which other ones might also be relevant. All standards should be considered regarding their possible relevance to any given evaluation task.
