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In 1950, when Mies van der Rohe designed the campus for IIT, the university was booming. Fifty years later, the student population had halved, but the size of the campus had doubled; its surroundings had also vanished, erased by slum clearance. Can a single architectural gesture recreate the urban densities on which Mies's original design depended?

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Casa da Musica Pg 304-315 The concert hall is a victim of its own success: rigidly defined by the necessity for perfect acoustics, most concert halls succumb to the time-tested reliablity of the "shoe box." For the architect bent on 7 innovation, what remains to be done once a typology has been perfected?

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
