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The cover map *Africae Nova Descriptio* – copper engraved, 550mm × 410mm – is by Wilhelm Blaeu, published in Amsterdam c.1650. This is one of the most celebrated maps on Africa from the 17th century. It combines relatively accurate geography for the time with elaborate illustrated borders detailing major cities and costumed figures of the continent.
